

Welcome to the Green Valley Recreation Duplicate Bridge Club!

Thank you for joining the Green Valley Recreation Duplicate Bridge Club (GVRDBC)! We hope that you have many enjoyable hours playing at the Club. Below is some information that we hope will make your initial experience easier and more fun.

Membership

The Club is a Green Valley Recreation, Inc. sanctioned club. To play at the Club, one must be a member of GVR, and show proof of membership when joining. Annual Club dues are currently \$2. American Contract Bridge League membership is encouraged, but is not required for play.

Type of Play

The GVRDBC holds American Contract Bridge League (ACBL) sanctioned bridge sessions. All games are played to ACBL rules. Depending on the day, the Club may host regular games, charity games, special team games, pro/am games, club championships, Unit games, and District games. All hands are pre-dealt, and hand results are electronically scored using Bridgemates. Directors are on hand for all sessions, and they are available to aid players in interpretation and application of ACBL rules of play. The Club actively supports ACBL's Zero Tolerance Policy. Bridge is a game and should be fun! We ask that all do their part to maintain a respectful and enjoyable environment.

Session Schedule and Play

Duplicate bridge games sanctioned by the American Contract Bridge League (ACBL) are held at the Canoa Hills Recreation Center, 3660 S. Camino Del Sol, Green Valley. Scheduled games occur every Monday, Thursday, and Friday afternoons beginning at 1:00 p.m.

Entries should be purchased no later than 12:50 p.m. to allow timely final game setup and session start. The fee charged depends on the type of game being played (e.g. \$2/pair for regular games, \$4/pair for charity games, \$6/pair for StaC games – the Club website show when these types of games occur and their prices). Please pay with paper currency only, no coins or checks please. Sessions finish at about 4:00 p.m. To meet facility time commitments, it is important that players adhere to the time limits assigned for each group of boards. Please limit "table talk" and hand discussion with partner to periods before a round of play, or after all hands in a round have been played. Keep conversations subdued so as not to disturb play in process at other tables.

North is responsible to ensure that the correct boards are available, that dealer and vulnerability is announced for each board, and that scores are correctly entered in the Bridgemate. Opponents (E/W) should verify all scores. Note that at the end of the day's play, E/W are responsible to bring the bidding boxes, pencils, Bridgemate, and table card from their last table of play to the designated collection point.

Unsolicited critique of another player's play is highly discouraged. If you make it known that you would like feedback and tips, most of the expert players will respond positively and offer their help.

Social Events

Twice yearly the Club has a potluck lunch. Be prepared to bring and share your favorite dish! These events will be announced, and will be on the Club calendar.

Bridge Classes and Instruction

There is no doubt that bridge is a challenging game. Thus, there is the opportunity for life-long learning and improvement. If you are a novice, beginner lessons can be extremely valuable for a positive start to our bridge play. Over time, all of us can benefit from coaching, guidance, and instruction to improve our play. The Club currently does not offer instruction, but classes have been offered in the past, and may be offered in the fall. The web site will keep you informed should classes resume. In addition, there are many credible on-line sources for instruction.
